# Identify your Stormwater System

- Know where it is and where it goes and how it operates under certain events.
- Public health infrastructure.
- Condition of the system .
- Operate in a more business-like manner.
- Information collected in the field.

# Inspection, Monitoring and Maintenance

- When do I inspect and how often?
- Develop baseline history.
- Look at structural components and other drainage areas .
- Monitor growth (vegetation).
- Depth of sediment in catch basins, detention/retention ponds.

## Inspection, Monitoring and Maintenance (cont.)

- Up-to-date maps.
- Buried manholes.
- Identify problem areas.
- Accessibility.
- Good equipment and the right equipment.

## Dispose of Wastes Properly

- Understand they most likely contain toxic pollutants that require documented disposal.
- Identify Types of Possible Pollutants.

# Management Plan

- Well thought out plan
- Framework for a structured approach to managing, operating and maintaining your stormwater system.
- Up-to-date SOP's or Effective Practice Guidelines.
- Public outreach.
- Training for staff.
- Emergency Response Plan.
