The Agency *NEAA* categories include: Research & Technology, Operations, Public Service, and Public Information & Education.

NACWA would like to acknowledge those individuals and member agencies that continually strive to make a positive impact on the environment. It is through the *National Environmental Achievement Awards* program, that we celebrate those outstanding individuals and innovative member agency programs and initiatives that exemplify environmental stewardship and a dedication to the clean water industry. Applications must be received by NACWA's National Office no later than **Friday, December, 5, 2008**.

How Will Honorees Be Selected for Recognition?

Each *National Environmental Achievement Award* application will be reviewed by NACWA's Awards Committee in February 2009. The *National Environmental Achievement* recognition program is non-competitive. Each nomination is judged individually based on eligibility and criteria.

Individual honorees will be recognized at a ceremony and reception during the National Clean Water Policy Forum, at the Renaissance Washington, DC Hotel in Washington, DC, May 3-6, 2009. Agency winners will be recognized at NACWA's Summer Conference and 39th Annual Meeting in Milwaukee, WI at the InterContinental Milwaukee, July 14-17, 2009.

2009 NEAA NOMINATION GENERAL GUIDELINES AND CHECKLISTS

GENERAL GUIDELINES

- Member agencies may submit no more than one National Environmental Achievement Award nomination per category. In the case of the Public Information and Education Award, one nomination may be submitted from among the four categories (Video, Printed Publication, Educational Program, E-media) encompassed by that award.
- Only NACWA Public Member Agencies may submit award nominations.
- Each nomination shall be endorsed, via signature on the application form, by the nominating agency's NACWA representative.
- National Environmental Achievement Award nominations involving multiple Association Members working collaboratively must be endorsed by each of the participating Members in order for each of the Members to receive awards.
- Applications will be reproduced for each member of the Awards Committee and should not be bound or faxed.

Program/Project Supporting Material Guidelines

Supporting materials are not required; however, limited additional materials will be accepted.

- Supporting materials such as reports, photographs, sample marketing materials, and video tapes should be supplemental to the information described in the Program/Project Narrative. (i.e. The Program/Project Narrative should fully describe the nomination without additional materials.)
- It is expected that applicants for the *Public Information & Education Award* category will submit a sample of the video, printed publication, e-medium or educational program material to support their application.

2009 NEAA ELIGIBILITY AND CRITERIA INFORMATION INDIVIDUAL ACHIEVEMENT AWARDS

Public Service Awards

The Awards Committee shall accept and consider nominations in four categories – Local (An award may be given for current elected or appointed officials in a service area of more than 250,000; and a second award may be given to current elected or appointed officials that have a service area population of less than 250,000.), State, and Federal.

Eligibility: Former or current elected or appointed public officials at the local, state, and federal level of government.

Criteria: Outstanding public service exhibiting a particular and continuing awareness of the challenges faced by municipal wastewater treatment agencies.

Distinguished Service Award

Eligibility: Individuals formerly representing Association member agencies who maintained an active role in the Association during their tenure.

Criteria: Efforts and dedication to the clean water industry while representing their agency.

Environment Award

Eligibility: Unrestricted.

Criteria: Outstanding environmental service.

2009 NEAA ELIGIBILITY AND CRITERIA INFORMATION MEMBER AGENCY ACHIEVEMENT AWARDS

Research & Technology Award

Eligibility: Development of a technological innovation related to wastewater treatment or biosolids/sludge use and disposal.

Criteria: Research project or technological innovation must directly relate to the processes of collection, treatment or reuse of wastewater or use or disposal of biosolids/sludge. Project must have been conducted in-house, or by consultant under direction of the agency. Project results must have practical application.

Operations Award

Eligibility: Outstanding project, system or method relating to wastewater treatment operations.

Criteria: Innovative and effective project, system or method relating to wastewater treatment plant or collection system operations developed and successfully implemented by a member in a cost-effective manner while achieving environmental compliance objectives.

Public Service Award

Eligibility: Significant contribution during the past year in local, state, or national public service related to wastewater treatment, public utility operation, or environmental protection.

Criteria: Involvement must be by agency staff or commissioners (directors, chairs) with no added payment for public services rendered. Public Service must be voluntary (not required by regulation or law).

Public Information and Education Awards *(one nomination per Member Agency)*

Video /Printed Publication /Educational Program

Eligibility: Outstanding and innovative video, printed publication, and/or educational program related to pollution prevention or control.

Criteria: Program, publication or video must have been produced by the agency staff or by an outside vendor at the express direction of the agency. Program, publication or video must encompass some aspect of the agency's operations, benefit the public educationally and have been produced for general use or distribution. Annual Reports are not accepted in this category.

E-Media

Eligibility: Outstanding member agency web site or downloadable, web-based program that relates to wastewater treatment or pollution prevention and control.

Criteria: Web site or downloadable, web-based program content must have been developed and produced by agency staff or by an outside vendor at the express direction of the agency. Web site or program must, at a minimum, cover some aspect of the agency's operations and must have been developed for general use.
