# Coastal Resilience for the Water Sector: Training for Technical Assistance Providers | Summer 2015

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) is offering coastal resilience trainings in four locations for water sector technical assistance providers. These 2-day trainings will focus on how technical assistance providers can use two new EPA tools to assist drinking water, wastewater and stormwater utilities in understanding and adapting to impacts from coastal storm events and related threats:

- ▶ **Climate Resilience Evaluation and Awareness Tool (CREAT), Version 3.0**  
CREAT assists water utility owners and operators in understanding potential climate change threats and in assessing the related risks at their individual utilities.
- ▶ **Storm Surge Inundation and Hurricane Strike Frequency Map**  
The Inundation Map illustrates the worst-case coastal storm surge or inundation scenarios and hurricane strike frequency data at a county level.

## Who Should Attend?

The trainings are for water sector technical assistance providers who support water sector climate risk assessments and climate adaptation planning. Technical assistance providers include:

- ▶ Circuit riders
- ▶ Water sector association staff
- ▶ Environmental trainers
- ▶ Academia
- ▶ Local, state, tribal, territorial and federal officials
