**Kara Reeve** manages National Wildlife Federation's Climate-Smart Communities program, which promotes the use of nature-based approaches to help communities be prepared for the impacts of climate change. Ms. Reeve is leading the development of a *Coastal Community Toolkit*, which is being developed with pilot communities in the Great Lakes region. She also worked with King County, Wash., to develop a tool to help landowners understand the climate change mitigation and adaptation benefits of healthy trees and is the author of an accompanying guidebook. Previously, she was the Technical Innovation Manager for ICLEI – Local Governments for Sustainability where she led the development and management of GHG protocols and mitigation, adaptation, and sustainability projects.
