Ryan Seiger received his BA from the University of Pennsylvania in 1993. He went on to get his law degree from Catholic University of America in 1998.

In 1993, Mr. Seiger came to Capitol Hill to work as a Staff Assistant for former Representative Robert Borski (D-PA). After only a year, he was promoted to Senior Legislative Assistant, a position he would hold for four years while simultaneously attending law school. Upon graduating from law school, he went to work for the Washington, D.C. firm of Arnold and Porter as a Law Clerk.

In 1999, Mr. Seiger joined the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure as Democratic Counsel for the Subcommittee on Water Resources and Environment. At the outset of the 110th Congress, Mr. Seiger was promoted to Staff Director of the Subcommittee on Water Resources and Environment. During his time as Staff Director of the Subcommittee, Mr. Seiger has helped to pass the landmark Water Resources Development Act of 2007, legislation to reauthorize the Clean Water State Revolving Fund (CWSRF), the BEACH Act, and legislation to reauthorize grants to address combined and sanitary sewer overflows. The Subcommittee is currently working on legislation to address the jurisdictional scope of the Clean Water Act, the Sewer-Right-to-Know legislation, the Great Lakes Legacy Act, U.S. Environment Protection Agency's (EPA) brownfields program, and reauthorization of several of the EPA's place based programs, such as the Chesapeake Bay Program Office and the Long Island Sound Office.
