Lisa Hollander has 26 years of experience in public utility management, public law practice, environmental, health and safety counseling, regulatory and legislative advocacy, and administrative and judicial litigation.

Ms. Hollander has been the General Counsel for Sanitation District No.1 (SD1) since February 2012, and is responsible for managing all legal issues encountered by the utility. As a member of the executive leadership team, she is responsible for strategic planning, policy development, and long-term financial management. Currently she is spearheading discussions with U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Region 4 and the Kentucky Energy and Environment Cabinet Division of Water regarding revisions to SD1's 2007 consent decree-based Integrated Watershed Plan.

Prior to SD1, Ms. Hollander was the Deputy Director of Law and Special Liaison for Legislative and Regulatory Affairs at the Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District (NEORS). She was in-house counsel for NEORS's Combined Sewer Overflow Long Term Control Plan negotiations and litigation with the Ohio Attorney General, the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency, the Environmental Protection Agency Region 5, and the U.S. Department of Justice (DOJ). She also provided legal counsel during the formation of NEORS's stormwater management program.

Ms. Hollander is an active member of the National Association of Clean Water Agencies (NACWA), where she serves as Chair of the Legal Affairs Committee. In 2001, she was given the Association's President's Award. Ms. Hollander was instrumental in the formation of the Association of Ohio Metropolitan Wastewater Agencies (AOMWA) and served as its first General Counsel.

Ms. Hollander earned her BA in Psychology and Human Services at Washington University in St. Louis, Mo., and her JD from The University of Texas at Austin School of Law. In 2004, she graduated from the Water and Wastewater Leadership Center at the Kenan-Flagler Business School, University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill.
