Ron Hill is the General Counsel for the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago ("District"), a position he has held for three years. He has been with the District for a total of almost 24 years. As General Counsel, he supervises 17 attorneys and 20 support staff. The Law Department of the District is responsible for overseeing all legal and transactional matters handled by the District, including environmental, real estate, litigation, employment and contract claims, as well as advising the Executive Director and Board of Commissioners on numerous substantive and procedural legal issues pertaining to the operation of the District and corporate governance. He is currently involved in a number of cases on behalf of the District that will significantly impact not only the District, but the entire Chicagoland area, such as the Asian Carp litigation, Citizen Suit litigation related to alleged violations of the Clean Water Act, and litigation involving the proposed entry of a consent decree relating to the District's long term control plan.

Mr. Hill received both his BS and JD from Loyola University of Chicago and has spoken on environmental and municipal law issues to groups such as the Illinois State Bar Association, Chicago Bar Association, and the City Club of Chicago.
