**Frank Dick** oversees the implementation of Vancouver's fully delegated pretreatment program. He has held the coordinator position since 2007. Vancouver's sewerage area serves a population of 200,000 and includes 20 permitted Significant Industrial Users, nine permitted Minor Industrial Users and over 50 other businesses with discharge authorizations. Half of his time is directed to industrial pretreatment activity, including oversight of surveying, permitting, enforcement and surveillance of industries, and oversees a staff of 2.5 full time employees. For the other half of his time, he plans and implements capital projects for the POTW and primarily focuses on energy efficiency projects. He has developed energy management programs for both of Vancouver's wastewater and water utilities.

Prior to Mr. Dick's position at Vancouver, he spent 17 years at semiconductor and electronics manufacturing facilities in the Portland-Vancouver area, in consultant and staff positions for facilities engineering and environmental compliance. He currently serves as the chair of the planning committee for the *Pacific Northwest Pretreatment Workshop*, to be held in September in Vancouver, Wash. He serves on the Oregon Association of Clean Water Agencies (ACWA) Board as the Energy Committee Chair. He is active nationally with National Association of Clean Water Agencies (NACWA), Water Environment Federation (WEF) and other organizations regarding non-dispersibles in the sanitary sewer collection system.

Mr. Dick earned his BS in Chemical Engineering from Washington State University.
