MaryLynn Lodor is a Deputy Director for the Metropolitan Sewer District of Greater Cincinnati (MSDGC) and Greater Cincinnati Water Works (GCWW) joint utility. As Deputy Director of Shared Services since April 2013, MaryLynn oversees Engineering and Watershed Management, Finance, Communications, Regulatory and Safety Compliance, Strategic Planning, Human Resources and Information Technology. In her previous position as Environmental Program Manager for MSDGC, Ms. Lodor developed the utility's sustainable infrastructure program which evaluated sustainable stormwater mitigation solutions to address combined sewer overflows (CSOs) and other water quality challenges within the context of MSDGC's Consent Decree. She has led MSDGC's "Communities of the Future" initiative since May 2009; this context sensitive approach explores the potential to link CSO solutions with community revitalization for an enhanced triple bottom line for the community. Prior to joining MSDGC in June 2010, Ms. Lodor worked as a consultant in the water, wastewater and watershed management field. She also worked for the Butler County (Ohio) Department of Environmental Services for 12 years, five as head of the Environmental Division overseeing industrial services, regulatory compliance, laboratory, public relations and program management.

Ms. Lodor holds a MS in Environmental Management & Policy from Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute and a BS degree in Business Administration from the State University of New York, Oswego.
